Why Revise Health & Safety Plan?

Updated Health & Safety Plan provides the following:

- A vehicle for moving forward
- Includes key infection control practices learned in a pandemic, adopted as a new routine
- Manages our response to a more predictable spread of infectious disease
- Provides a clear and sustainable approach to mitigation



INTERESTS OF THE HEALTH & SAFETY PLAN

Our neighborhood public schools play a essential role in the vibrancy, unity and well-being of our community. We will remain firmly grounded in our interests. With that in mind, we will:

- Offer a high-quality, comprehensive educational experience 5 days a week
- Be clear, consistent, and sustainable in our approach to mitigation
- Respond in a thoughtful and least restrictive way -- we provide a laser-focused response to keep the impact on families, students, and staff minimal
- Mindful and supportive of physical, social and emotional well being of students, staff, families and our community
- Maintain ongoing relationship and communication with local community health professionals



Key Mitigation Strategies

School Health & Safety Plan

- Follow <u>District illness procedure</u> and protocols when someone becomes sick.
- Continue to train and educate staff, students, and parents on key infection control practices like hand-washing and proper hand-sanitizing procedures.
- Facilities and Operations staff will continue to monitor and maintain ventilation systems and custodial staff will continue recommended surface disinfection procedures.

KEY MITIGATION STRATEGIES

- Face coverings for all students, staff and visitors will be optional
- Return to pre-pandemic visitor and volunteer protocols
- Reinstate pre-pandemic school activities (ie: dances/clubs/field trips)
- Implement and follow the <u>illness procedure</u> guidelines
 - District PSA for students and parents on updated BSD illness procedures
 - Health Services training to insure district-wide implementation of BSD illness procedures

*The district will consider guidance provided by national and local health professionals and current District data if we need to transition back to a pandemic plan.
